







State sales and use tax exemptions are available to taxpayers who manufacture, fabricate or process tangible personal property for sale. The manufacturing exemption applies to machinery or equipment that causes a physical or chemical change in a product in order to make it saleable.



Incentives

Example:

A project bringing \$15MM CapEx and 50 high-wage Jobs in a target industry to the region could qualify for almost \$1 million across six incentive areas, including property tax abatements, TEF, Enterprise Zone, Skills Development, and City of San Antonio EDIF.


