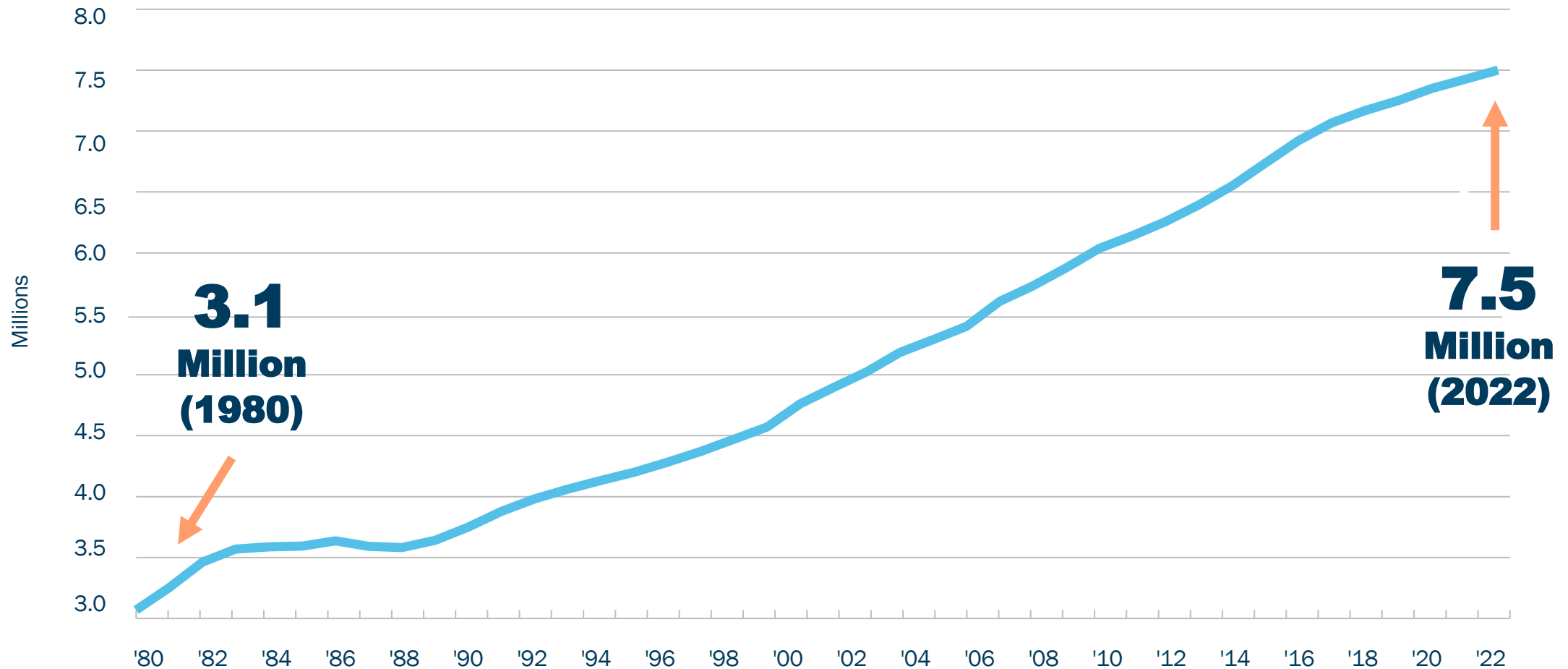

Metro Houston Population Growth



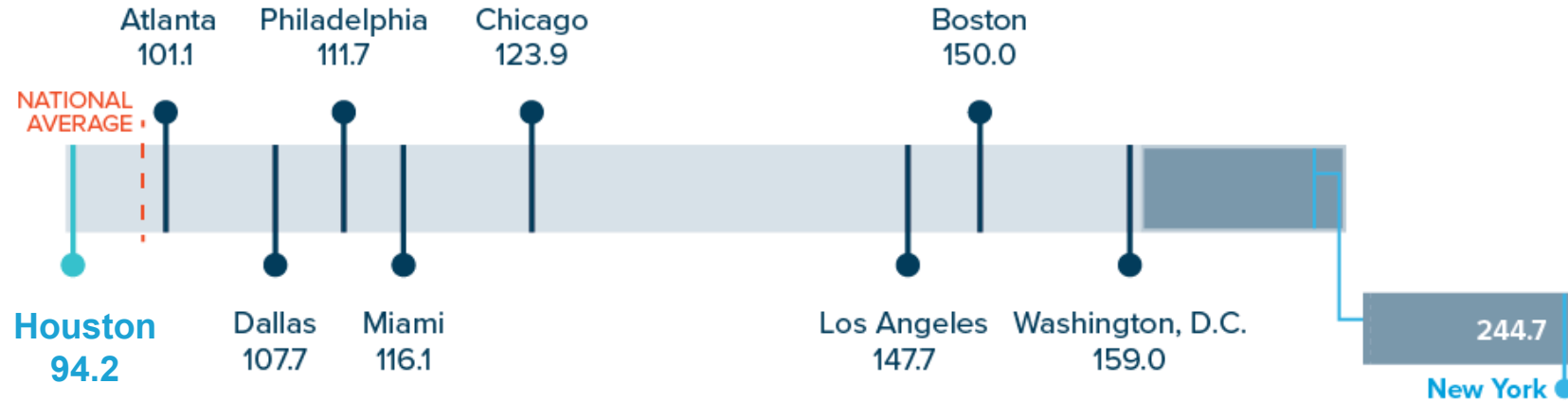

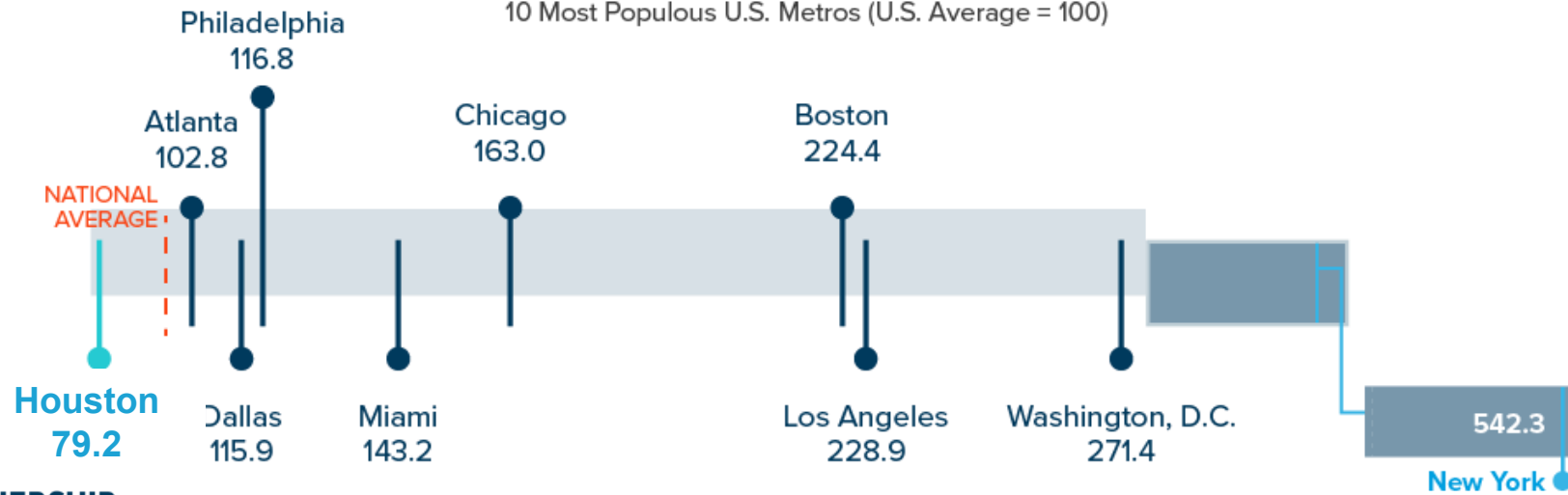
COST OF LIVING COMPARISON

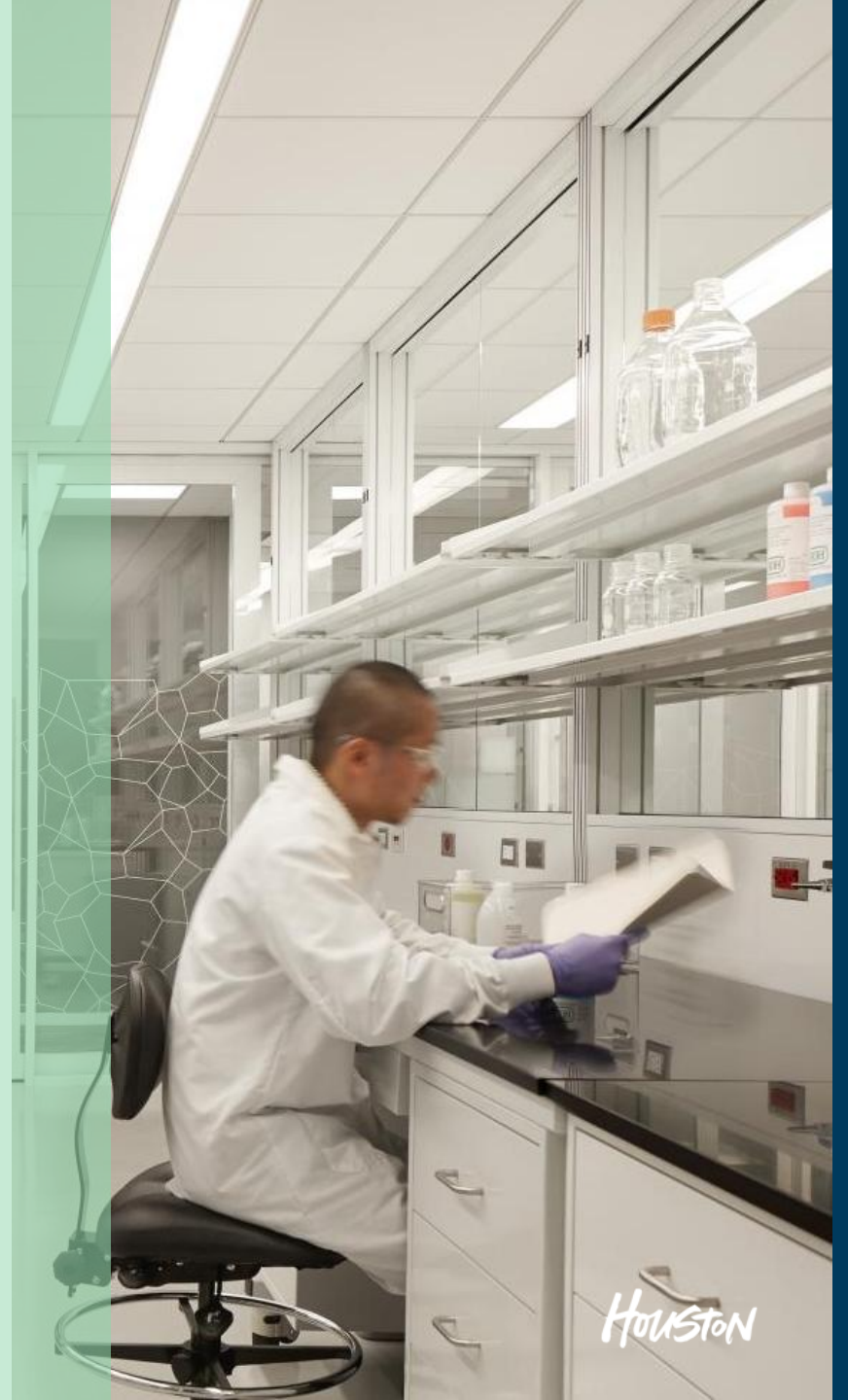

PackGene Biotech expands in Houston



PackGene Biotech Inc., an adeno-associated viral (rAAV) vector CRO and CDMO, expanded its U.S. services with a new cGMP biomanufacturing and processing facility in Houston in early 2023. The **25,000-square-foot facility** includes process and analytical laboratories, cGMP manufacturing cleanrooms and support areas, quality control laboratories, a warehouse, and office space.
